CODE OF ETHICS OF MATERIALS RESEARCH & TECHNOLOGY INC.

To safeguard public health, social welfare, the quality of products or services and to maintain integrity and high levels of performance, practice and conduct in the NON-DESTRUCTIVE TESTING OPERATOR/INSPECTOR trade, one must be aware of the following principles and the scope to which it applies, understanding that any unauthorized practice is subject to review by the certification committee of the MR&T certification body, or whoever exercises its functions, and may result in the temporary or permanent cancellation of the certification . The code of ethics is applicable from the moment the registration request for qualification and certification is made.

INTEGRITY

The Inspector must act with complete integrity in professional matters and accept the scope of this Regulation.

RESPONSIBILITY TOWARDS THE PUBLIC

The Inspector must act to preserve the health and well-being of the public, carrying out the required inspection tasks in a conscientious and impartial manner to fully comply with civic and professional responsibilities. In accordance with the above, the Inspector must:

Perform only functions for which their competence is certified.

Present your card or certificate when required.

Do not falsify qualifications, nor change the level of certification by modifying the certification documents or verbal or written falsehood of the permanent testimony of the certified level or its validity.

Be completely objective, clear and concise in your written reports, pronouncements or work testimonials and include all relevant or pertinent testimonials in your communications and writings.

PUBLIC STATEMENTS

The Inspector must not issue judgments, criticisms or arguments regarding inspection, which are inspired or paid for by interested parties.

The Inspector must not publicly express opinions on aspects related to inspection, unless he has adequate knowledge of the issues he publishes, based on technical competence regarding the subject and with the honest conviction of the truth and authorship of the pronouncement.

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INTEREST CONFLICT

The Inspector must avoid conflicts of interest with the client and must refrain from any business partnership or circumstance that he deems so.

The Inspector should not accept financial or other compensation from more than one party for their services on the same project, unless there are circumstances that are fully understood and agreed upon by all parties.

The Inspector must not accept or solicit gratuities, direct or indirect, from any or all parties having to do with the client, the employer or the builder, in connection with the inspection work.

RESPONSIBILITY IN THE WORK SITE

The Inspector must not pay, solicit, or offer, directly or indirectly, any bribe or commission for their professional services.

The Inspector must not falsify, exaggerate, or collaborate in the misrepresentation of academic and professional qualifications, previous tasks, achievements and associated responsibilities.

Misinterpretation of the validity of the certifications is considered a violation of this section.

The Inspector must not work as an independent Inspector in a field other than his qualification, nor can he certify tests that are not within his competence.

NOTE: The certification does not authorize you to approve procedure designs that require the signature of a professionally licensed Specialist Engineer.

UNAUTHORIZED PRACTICE

Any violation of a part of the pattern of conduct described above and related to the functions of the Inspector, including negligence, ineptitude due to lack of attitudes, skills or knowledge, and any violation of the code of ethics contained in these Regulations, is subject to constituting an unauthorized practice and in fact will lead to the imposition of sanctions.
